
HOW CAN I HELP? WE'RE GLAD YOU ASKED!

As we approach the conclusion of another remarkable year, we find ourselves eager to share our humble efforts made in furthering the Kingdom, all thanks to your unwavering support. Your steadfast commitment has been the bedrock of our endeavors, and we are delighted to offer you a glimpse into the impactful journey we've undertaken throughout 2023.

In a humble attempt to strengthen the impact of the Manna Project, we made the decision to relocate the Manna Project to the Forest Hill Church of Christ in Memphis, Tennessee. This move has placed us in a more collaborative environment with other brotherhood works and mission works under a solid eldership. The support from the Forest Hill eldership has been invaluable, and their leadership has provided some amazing opportunities, including my involvement with students at the Memphis School of Preach (MSOP) interested in mission work. This year, I've had the privilege of teaching classes within the Missions Program, and in the coming year, I will formally instruct some classes at MSOP in the Missions Program. I believe this partnership will yield significant benefits for the Kingdom.

We have plans for a group trip to Palengue, Mexico, scheduled for March. During a recent visit, Kelly and I were deeply moved by the dedicated Christians in Palenque working tirelessly to spread the gospel. This upcoming trip, involving both teenagers and adults, offers a unique opportunity for our youth and their parents to integrate into the local community, engage in door-to-door outreach, and share the message of the Jesus and His Church in Palenque.

Our preaching schools in Uganda and Tanzania continue to thrive, thanks to your steadfast support. These institutions serve as pivotal hubs for equipping individuals with the tools necessary to make a lasting impact in their respective countries. Witnessing the achievements of these schools in training the future preachers of Uganda and Tanzania fills us with immense pride.

A significant milestone achieved this year includes the acquisition of a block building machine to be used for the construction of new church buildings for many new church plants in Tanzania. The school is doing great, students have now adopted a system of having gardens around school for their own and as a startup to be self-supporting. A bout the lord's work here, it is generally great, looking at baptisms, restoration, and new congregations.

Jhapa Resource Center | NEPAL

Pramod Dhakal (Nepali Director): "As we come closer to year end, we are looking back whole year 2023 what God has blessed us with in Nepal. This year we made two trips to east Nepal and more trips to Far West. In total we had 21 baptisms this year, 4 out of these were from east Nepal and rest of all from Tikapur. Besides Evangelical trip to east and Far west, we devoted remaining times to strengthening local congregations in Nepal through daily evening zoom class and National and International Bible Webinar fortnightly. We have been laboring more than two years teaching and training 10 young men. We sent them out to the world equipping with much needed spiritual sword to win souls for our King. We also assisted with the earthquake helping 195 families in the West. Looking forward to new hope in 2024!"

Our last trip to Uganda was very profitable in meeting the new RSOP students (20). The main emphasis was instructing them in agricultural practices. Other efforts off campus argeted two preachers, Kenson (Kitoko) & Ronald (Maliba) with agricultural efforts to improve their home productions. There were over 30 attending the Saturday agriculture seminar at Kenson's home. Most of the time was out in his garden, hands in the dirt action. We finished up seated in his home with more instruction and a question/answer period. On another day, Justin and I toured Ronald's land and garden making suggestions on improving his agricultural efforts. It was most enjoyable to see their interest in learning. We have received pictures how they have put these lessons into practice. Our next mission trip is to Tanzania the first of January, 2024.


